- The daughter in the back seat was crying and traumatized, she was never going to trust the cops again.
- They met in mediation and discussed the situation, the purpose of "meet and greet", and the daughter in the backseat. As they discussed what happened the man and woman apologized for overreaching. The officers admitted they could have taken time to explain and maybe not gone to the cuffs immediately.
- The officers talked specifically to the nine year old, and said they were sorry she was afraid. They were here to help people, not scare them. She warmed up and said she was now OK and not afraid of the police.
